We are halfway through our study of the Essential Tenets held by our church and our denomination. If we really believe the simple truth of the song above:

- Why are we looking at our foundational beliefs (again)?
- Why are we wrestling with mysteries and paradoxes, big words and bigger concepts—things that we readily admit are beyond our ability to comprehend?
- Why are we so concerned about doctrine and theology?

It's enough to cause our brains to ache! Why can't we just sing "Jesus Loves Me"?

#### Here's why:

- When you compare the amount of time you spend reading God's Word and learning biblical truth vs. the amount of time you spend absorbing all kinds of messages through social media and TV, what do you think is the predominant influence shaping your worldview- directly or subtly?
- We do not have enough knowledge about what we believe and why we believe it to stand strong in the face of the barrage of anti-God, anti-Bible, anti-church rhetoric that continually confronts us.
- When our children go off to college and our young adults go into the workforce, they are
  unequipped to answer the questions and counter the challenges that they face every day.
  Their faith is rocked and often broken.
- When we try to understand what God says about some aspect of life, we must examine "the
  whole counsel of God." It is not enough to read one or two passages or books of Scripture:
  God's truth is revealed as we study what is taught from Genesis to Revelation. Theology (the
  systematic study of God and God's relation to the world) or Doctrine (a set of beliefs held and
  taught by a church) are attempts to look at the whole picture and boil it down to a faithful
  summary of God's Word and Truth.
- Knowing what we believe and why we believe it shapes our identity and how we live.
- Knowing what we believe and why we believe it equips us to share God's truth with others.

#### So, stick with it!

Exercise your 3-lb. brain until it aches!

Wrestle with things that are too big for us to fully understand . . . it gives us a deeper sense of awe for the God who does!

"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have" (1 Peter 3:15).

Then you can come back to the simple truth of the gospel and sing with confidence and joy:

Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so.

### SESSION UPDATE AND TRANSITION REPORT - LINDA WILLETS, CLERK OF SESSION

The Session held its regular meeting on October 7, 2015. This fall continues to be an exciting time in the life of FPC:E-

- What a blessing for our church to have 15 children in grades 3-6 and 4 adults registered to attend the Children's Fall Overnight Weekend at Rock Mountain on October 16 & 17, 2015.
- The Children's Ministry Kick-Off was great! In a fun and interactive way, the foundation was laid
  for the Route 66 curriculum. This year we want children to EXPERIENCE: God's Word, God's
  Love, God's Forgiveness, God's Adoption- and as a result, obey God's Call in their life.
- The Small Group Ministry is currently working to support our church-wide study of the Essential Tenets and also beginning to preview Lenten studies for next year. Small groups are challenged to think about whom they might invite to join them.
- The Nominating Committee gave thanks to God for the encouraging responses of people asked to prayerfully consider serving as elders or deacons in the coming year.
- The Mission and Stewardship Committee reported:
  - ♦ They will be using a newly redesigned commitment card with the new FPC:E logo.
  - The focus of this year's stewardship emphasis will be a 48-hour prayer vigil preceding Stewardship Dedication Sunday on November 22.
  - The elders have committed to increase their own commitment and to participate in the service on November 15 when we address Essential Tenet #7– Faithful Stewardship of All of Life.
  - M&S awarded scholarships from the "Mission Sponsorship Fund" to Hemant and Saima Tandi as they lead two groups to Orissa, India in November.
  - ♦ Adjustments were made to 2015 mission dollars to reflect this year's transition to ECO.
  - Approval was given for a "church-sponsored" mission trip to the Dominican Republic. Bruce, Rebecca, and Erica Barney will be leading the trip over Christmas break.
- The final Deacon's Pantry was held on October 5, 2015. The deacons will be partnering with Mother Theresa's Cupboard at St. Ambrose to provide personal care items now as well as financial support.
- The House Committee is hoping to address two immediate concerns: repairing the potholes in the parking lots before winter, and organizing/reducing items in our limited storage areas.
- Five members of Session attended the ECO-Presbytery of the Northeast Meeting on October 2&3, 2015. The ECO 2016 National Conference is being held in January in California; commissioners from the Session were elected to attend.
- We are hosting our Mission Affinity Group on Saturday, October 24.
- Treasurer Art Davis gathered/organized all the information so Session could have an initial conversation about the 2016 church budget. While Session knows that this is a critical year, they also believe that within this congregation, we have everything we need to accomplish what God wants us to do, if we all give prayerfully and obediently. Please participate in the prayer vigil.

## DEACON AND ELDER ROLES IN ECO - CAROLYN PREISENDANZ AND DAID JENKINS, RULING ELDERS

As our congregation makes the denominational transition from the Presbyterian Church USA (PC(USA)) to ECO: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians, it is useful to consider what roles deacons and elders have had in the Presbyterian church in general and what, if any, changes may be allowed in these officer positions in ECO.

#### **Deacons**

The office of deacon was established early in the New Testament church to make sure food was distributed to widows and others in need (Acts 6:1-6). The leader of the first group of deacons was Stephen. Within the Presbyterian church, deacons are ordained members (covenant partners) who pursue the scriptural practice of expressing the love of Christ by caring for the poor, distributing food to the hungry, ministering to the sick and lonely, collecting school supplies and other materials for the needy, assisting with communion preparation, and performing other acts of service in the church.

#### The Ministry of Deacons as stated in ECO Polity 2.02:

Ordinarily, the biblical office of deacon shall be utilized by the congregation. Deacons lead ministries that nurture fellowship and caregiving within and beyond the congregation. Deacons may also be asked to preach and teach. The congregation shall determine the manner in which they are selected for service. The session shall oversee and direct the ministry of the deacons.

The polity allows for the congregation to determine how deacons are selected. At this time the Nominating Committee is selecting deacon nominees using the same procedures that have been used by this church for many years, namely through prayer and fasting, personal conversations with potential nominees, and finally through election of the slate of nominees by the congregation.

What is new about the office of deacon as we move to ECO:

The polity states that deacons may also be asked to preach and teach. In Scripture we see that at least two of the original deacons, Stephen and Philip (Acts 6:5), were active in preaching and baptizing (Acts 6:8, 7, 8:4-12).

#### **Elders**

Elders in the Presbyterian church are called to be spiritual leaders, strengthening and nurturing the faith and life of the congregation.

#### The Ministry of Elders as stated in ECO Polity 2.01:

Elders are given authority and responsibility, along with pastors, to oversee the spiritual health of the congregation as well as the congregation's faithfulness to God's mission. Elders shall be elected by the congregation.

#### DEACON AND ELDER ROLES IN ECO CONT.

Responsibilities of the elders include overseeing the spiritual well-being and growth of the church, being the chairs, or having oversight, of the committees/ministry teams, having fiduciary oversight and vision, and considering what mission activities the church should support. Within the PC(USA), elders were permitted to serve up to two consecutive three-year terms. Within ECO, there is more flexibility in the duration and number of terms an elder may serve. Regardless of any changes adopted by the church in the length of a term or number of terms served, all members of session continue to be elected by the congregation.

#### **Expanded Role in ECO: Elders and Deacons as Lay Pastors**

At the heart of it, a church is a gathering of believers in the name of Jesus in different settings and in different contexts. In order to increase the mission and ministry of a church or presbytery, there are times when it may be advantageous to commission elders and deacons to greater levels of service. Elders and deacons who have been properly trained can be authorized to provide pastoral leadership and administer the sacraments. There are two general circumstances that would call for this: (1) serving within the church while remaining under the supervision of session and a pastor, head of staff, or transitional pastor, or (2) by being commissioned to serve in the role of pastor or head of a new church (ECO Polity 2.0502).

Membership in ECO has afforded First Presbyterian Church: Endicott new freedoms, along with new responsibilities to determine new ways to reach others and together grow in Christ. Let us take this opportunity to prayerfully determine who has the gifts of service as deacons and elders of this church and support them in our efforts to carry the life-saving message of Jesus' sacrifice for our sins and God's eternal love for us.

#### **ECO INFORMATION SERIES**
