PASTORS' PAGE - TIM AND JAN DEVINE, CO-PASTORS

For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6)

We watch images on TV, listen to reports on the radio, read accounts in the news. . . sometimes it is so hard to trust that the Prince of Peace has come and that He has authority over this broken world.

Just as puzzling is what we can do in response to evil and sin, because the problems are so big. What can I do about the refugee crisis in Syria and Iraq? Bombs exploding in crowded cities like Paris, Beirut, and Yola, Nigeria? People facing persecution across the globe?

The apostle Paul tells us to "hate what is evil, cling to what is good." (Romans 12:9) We can get behind that! But what does that really look like? Not what you might expect or like. Paul goes on to say. . .

Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another. . . Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. . . if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads. Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. (Romans 12:11-21)

And if that weren't challenging enough, Paul tells us that persevering in prayer includes this: I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity. This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. (I Timothy 2:1-4)

Wait, you think, Paul isn't here today to see what is happening. He wouldn't tell us to pray for evil, oppressive leaders. Ah, but Paul's circumstances were very similar. The early church was persecuted by both the secular Roman government and the religious authorities. Both wanted Paul dead and the Christian movement stamped out. Christians throughout the known world were suffering, fleeing, and dying at the hands of enemy authorities. And still, this is how Paul taught us to pray.

Well, you might say, Paul was not realistic. He can't really expect us to pray for horrible people. But if we won't listen to Paul, then hear what Jesus said, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:44)

The one who is called Prince of Peace and Mighty God, the One whose birth we are about to celebrate, the One who came into the world so that all might live said, "*Pray for those who persecute you.*" If we are to be obedient., we will pray.

- Tell your children how you are praying for them, not just that you are praying for them.
- Share how you see God at work throughout the day or week.
- Share your mistakes/sins even as you correct theirs.
- Pray with them about real life, not just about vague things.— and listen for God's answers!
- Reclaim the cracks of time you have with your children to intentionally talk/disciple them.

SESSION UPDATE AND TRANSITION REPORT - LINDA WILLETS, CLERK OF SESSION

First, I would like to express my appreciation to the Session members and pastors for their support as I became clerk of Session following Janet Frederick's move to Florida after many years of faithful service in our church. It has been a privilege to serve with this amazing group of church leaders, and I look forward to continued service in the years to come.

A joint meeting of elders, deacons, and program staff was held on November 4, 2015. Garry Ingraham, from the Love & Truth Network, presented his story and mission. It was followed by Q&A concerning how our congregation might implement ways to become both radically welcoming and radically transforming in dealing with the relational and sexual brokenness within all of us.

Session dealt with its regular business afterward, and the following items were addressed:

- Recent communication with the Taiwanese church, whose children participate in our children's ministry. Staff members affirmed that the children's curriculum aligns with the Essential Tenets of this church and ECO.
- Sharon Early received positive feedback about a possible 2016 Lenten study on prayer. She is also starting to develop another option for connecting people in micro-groups, as well as our current small groups.
- Nominating Committee presented the list of 2016 nominees for deacons, elders, and membersat-large. We give thanks for a full slate of elders and deacons!
- Route 66 and What's in the Bible are proving to be great resources for the children's ministry.
 Alisha Finn is challenging parents to make church attendance and children's ministry a priority.
 She is encouraging parents to explore teaching life and attitude lessons to their children to help them EXPERIENCE God's Word, God's Love, God's Forgiveness, God's Adoption, and OBEY God's Call on their life.
- The Junior High Youth Group has been going well. Families have hosted many Sunday nights at their homes.
- Blacklight & Boomwhackers rehearsals will be held on Thursday evenings through Christmas.
- Mission & Stewardship Committee wrote thank you notes to families of the memorials used to help pay for the renovation of the stained glass windows.
- Session approved 2016 Mission Funds (\$84,980), which reflects the same % decrease as the projected decrease of the general budget and shifts in mission partners as we move to ECO.
- Session approved the remainder of the undesignated 2015 Mission Funds (\$777) to be allocated to: Love & Truth Network - \$500; Mercy House - \$277 (plus \$723 from the unused Good Shepherd chapel fund for a total of \$1000).
- Session approved \$518 from a previous Dominican Republic trip to be designated for the January 2016 trip, to use either for scholarships or for the work that will be done.
- Elders prepared to lead worship on November 15. They will deal with Essential Tenet #7- our call to be faithful stewards of all of life.
- Session approved Jen Hunt and Sharon Early as additional signatories for the church accounts.
- Additional church members are needed for the Investment Committee.
- The MAG Gathering, scheduled for October 24, will be rescheduled in the spring.
- Session approved the Annual Congregational Meeting to be held on Sunday, February 7, 2016.
- Session approved the women's IF Gathering to be held at our church on February 5 & 6, 2016.
