*If Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain  
and your faith has been in vain. . .  
If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.  
(1 Corinthians 15:14, 19)*

A woman recently told us about a conversation she had with someone she cares about deeply—someone who claims to not believe in God.

She said, “OK, if you decide you are an atheist, I will respect your decision. But you need to be able to tell me why. You can’t be a lazy atheist. So, I want you figure out if the tomb was empty or not, because everything rests on this one question: Did Christ rise from the dead?”

Apparently that question was at the center of conversations the apostle Paul had 2,000 years ago as well. And Paul agreed with those who were questioning the resurrection, that there are serious implications if Christ has not been raised:

- Our preaching is in vain (verse 14).
- Our faith is in vain (verse 14).
- We will be found to be misrepresenting God (verse 15).
- Our faith is not only futile; we are still in our sins (verse 17).
- Those who have died in Christ will perish (verse 18).
- And we, of all people, are most to be pitied (verse 19).

Paul agreed that our lives would be futile and our disillusionment would be devastating if Christ did not rise. But then he went on to proclaim:

*But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died!  
(1 Corinthians 15:19)*

The women at the tomb, the disciples, and more than 500 people were witnesses. They saw, heard, touched, and ate with the risen Christ. They were so certain of Jesus’ resurrection that they were willing to endure exile, poverty, persecution, and martyrdom to share that truth with others. Who would knowingly defend a lie when they had nothing to gain from a worldly perspective?? If it is not true, Paul said, “*why are we putting ourselves in danger every hour?*”

Because we believe Jesus did indeed rise, we claim the opposite of all the things Paul laid out in verses 14-19:

We, of all people, are most to be envied! We will not perish! We are no longer slaves to sin! Rather than misrepresenting God, we have His truth to share! We have put our trust in the right place! We can trust what the apostles preached is true— then and now!

*For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. (1 Corinthians 15:21-22)*

## CONNECTING THOUGHTS


I have been experiencing a truth that Beth Guckenberger shared in a recent webinar: *“Vision is listening to the Lord and taking the next step.”* The Lenten study has been powerful, yet it was not what I originally thought we would be doing. I had no idea we would be incorporating a prayer room with the study, yet while attending the ECO gathering in January, I experienced their prayer room and how powerful it was to have others pray for our church and our upcoming study. I came back convicted that putting together a prayer room was one of our next steps, even though I did not know how it would all come together. It unfolded one week at a time- in God’s timing, not mine- and dovetailed right into the weekly sessions of the study. Many of the stations were quite different than what I originally envisioned, and since I am not overly creative, it was definitely an unfolding of God’s vision. To be honest, I typically feel the most connected to God in nature; yet I have had some powerful prayer time in the prayer room by quieting myself and listening for God’s leading on who and how to pray for situations.

I have also been thinking a lot about personal prayer space. Do we each have a place, in our home or out in nature, where we can regularly go and intentionally quiet ourselves and listen for God’s leading? One of my first experiences with this was when we were moving the Spragues, and I saw the area Wendell had set up in their basement as his prayer space. It was nothing fancy, basically a rocking chair placed inside some partitions, but he knew when he entered that space that family and obligations were put on hold and he was going to be praying.

Pictured to the right is what another young family has created for their own personal prayer space to remind them to trust God and bring everything to Him. What a testimony to their children that they have a spot set aside in their home—especially since their apartment is limited in space and it could have easily been justified that there just wasn’t enough room. It has me rethinking how I use our space and where I might be able to create a sacred area within our home.

### 40 Days of Prayer —

One of the next steps to understand God's vision for us as a congregation is that we be in intentional prayer for FPC:Endicott, our ministries, our people, and our own individual roles in our congregation. Starting April 5, we are asking that the congregation as a whole spend 40 days in intentional prayer leading up to Pentecost on May 15. A prayer booklet will be available with different prayer requests for the church and devotions for each day. In the booklet, there will be space to journal as part of your "listening prayers." In May, we will ask the congregation to share how you sense God leading as we seek God's vision for our church and its mission here on the corner of Grant and Monroe. During this time the prayer room in the chapel will continue to be available.

At the March 2, 2016 meeting of Session, the pastors reported:

- Their Pastor Accountability Group (PAG) was formed with Karen Ballard (Rome), Dennis Dillman (Hallstead), and Michael Lyle (Honesdale). The first meeting was February 17 and all are excited for this new relationship of accountability and support.
- FPC:E's Mission Accountability Group (MAG) will now be with the above four churches and may change in the future as new churches join ECO and our presbytery.
- Two students are meeting with Jan and Alisha as they prepare to profess their faith and become members of FPC:E on Sunday, April 10, 2016.
- Session approved the baptisms of Emma and Olivia (Kerr) Bates and Easton Kamper on Sunday, April 10, 2016.
- Permission was given to Tim to pursue the tennis outreach program again this summer in partnership with the Boys' & Girls' Club and the U-E school district.
- A new member's class will be offered after Easter.

In other areas of ministry and celebration:

- Groups are actively engaged in the Lenten study on prayer as they process the material, wrestle with concepts, and pray. 118 members and non-members are participating in the study.
- A Prayer Room has been created within the Chapel and is open each day. Each week a new prayer station has been added (Praise Banner, Praying in and through the Spirit, Confessional Prayer, Listening Prayer, Intercessory Prayer).
- The church will offer three opportunities to study the last session of the Lenten study on "Starting a Prayer Ministry in your Church." They will be offered after each service on Sunday, April 3, and on Monday evening, April 4.
- April 10, 2016, will be an exciting day of celebration with the Children's Ministry at FPC:E! We will have one service at 10:00am, led by the children and students. We will also celebrate several baptisms and students joining the church.
- Session approved the 2016 Session-Approved Mission Causes as presented by the Mission and Stewardship Committee.
- A letter was sent to the Broome County Council of Churches encouraging them to continue to boldly lift high Jesus Christ and the cross through their ministry to our community.
- FPC:E was invited to be part of the ribbon cutting ceremony of the Mercy House. FPC:E donated an engraved cross to be hung in the chapel.
- Sharon Early and Linda Willets volunteered to be our Elder Commissioners for the April 8-9 presbytery meeting at Lycoming Centre PC (Williamsport).
- FPC:E will host the Spring Mission Affinity Group (MAG) gathering on April 30.
- At the end of the business portion of the meeting, Session members listened to Kara Powell's "Sticky Faith" presentation from the National ECO Conference held in January 2016.


