#### GALATIANS-THE MAGNA CARTA OF CHRISTIANITY

In 1215, the Archbishop of Canterbury first drafted the Magna Carta (Latin for *The Great Charter*) to establish peace between King John of England and a group of rebel barons. It promised protection, justice, and freedom. Although the charter was amended, annulled, broken, and repealed over the years, it was influential in the formation of the American Constitution in 1787 and still stands as an important symbol of liberty today.



The New Testament book of Galatians has been called the Magna Carta of Christianity. In his letter to the church of Galatia, the Apostle Paul calls the church to deep and abiding faith in the liberating gospel of grace. This grace does not give us license to live recklessly, but instead invites us to experience a joyful freedom from self-reliance, human effort, and autonomy. In Jesus Christ, we have been set free to live out the gospel of Christ alone by faith alone!

It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. (Galatians 5:1)

# Following are 5 great family summer devotion ideas from <u>www.ministry-to-children.com</u>.

#### Try them out as you travel, stay home, get outside, or simply have family time!

- 1. **THE ZOO:** Hunt for five of the most bizarre animal facts. Discuss God's purpose in His specific design of each animal. Try to find an animal for each letter of the alphabet. Make an A to Z book. Talk about Adam's job to name the animals. What names would you have chosen?
- 2. **THE BEACH:** Build a sandcastle near the tide, on the sand. Build another one on a rock on higher land. Read Matthew 7:24-27. Discuss the wise man and the foolish man. How does that apply to us? Sing "The Wise Man Built His House Upon The Rock."
- 3. **THE BACKYARD:** Go cloud watching. Read Psalm 19:1, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands."
  - a. Plant a vegetable or flower garden. Take care of it daily. Read Mark 4:30-32, the parable of the mustard seed.
  - b. Hunt for bugs. Find a caterpillar and a butterfly. Discuss 2 Corinthians 5:17.
  - c. At night, chase fireflies. Notice how they stand out in the darkness. Discuss John 8:12. Play flashlight tag. Sing, "This Little Light of Mine." Search for constellations.
- 4. **THE FARM:** Ask a local farmer if you can assist him for the day (or even an hour). Ask him questions about his job. Discuss how it relates to Scripture. Try to find the four soils explained in Matthew 13.
- 5. **A ROAD RACE:** Read 1 Corinthians 9:24-25 or Hebrews 12:1-2. Train for a race yourself and model healthy living for your children. If your child is old enough, have them participate in a race with you just for the fun of it. What do races teach us about living the Christian life?

#### A note to parents...

This season we have taken an incredible journey through the 66 Books of the Bible on Sunday mornings in Children's Ministry. Starting in Genesis and working our way through an overview of the Old and New Testaments has been an exciting and formidable challenge! A foundation has been laid so when we double back, kids will have a launching point for each of the 66 Books.

Every child received a coloring workbook in April that covers the Books of the Old Testament. Please, Please, Please take the time to work through the pictures and descriptions with the kids as the summer progresses! You will learn a lot!

We also used a DVD series called "What's In The Bible...?" this season. There are thirteen lively and entertaining DVD's that introduce each Book of the Bible. Each DVD has 2 Episodes. If watched from start to finish, they do a great job of explaining God's Rescue Plan for us starting at creation and ending in completion with Christ's return.

This summer we would like you to take advantage of our "What's In The Bible?" DVD library! Sign out a DVD each week, watch it, learn from it, talk about it with your kids, and then simply bring it back the following Sunday and sign out the next one!

### We will have these DVD's available to sign out in the gathering space each Sunday morning following the service.

#### CONNECTING THOUGHTS FROM OUR SEASON OF PRAYER - SHARON EARLY

We seem to have finally entered spring—the tulips out front bloomed reminding us to invest in others; the fountain in the chapel has been relocated back to the prayer garden between the sanctuary and education building out back and summer projects are beginning to occur around the building. One of these projects is re-working the prayer room in the chapel. We are still discerning what a prayer ministry at FPC:Endicott will look like in its entirety, but one of the aspects that many have agreed upon is it was meaningful to have a sacred space in the church dedicated to prayer. The following elements of the prayer room will remain in place throughout the summer:

- A (quieter) fountain reminding us that Jesus has brought us eternal life (Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." John 4:13-14) )
- Background music to help quiet the "chatter" both within ourselves and the surrounding building. It is great to have our building utilized in so many ways but sometimes our "busy-ness" drowns out being able to hear the Spirit at work within us.





- The intercessory prayer wall has become a place for prayers to be left: private ones rolled up and placed in the wall, cards posted of intentional prayers that others can be praying for, or a prayer dove- left on the symbolic spirit ribbons for when we know that only through the spirit praying on our behalf will a situation be resolved on this side of eternity. Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. Romans 8:26-27
- Scripture Promise cards are also available for when we need to meditate on Scripture and listen for God's promises spoken long ago as well as to us individually in the present age.

One other aspect of prayer that is being rolled out this summer was an idea shared from a sister church of member prayer cards. We desire our church to be a house of prayer and in doing so, one aspect would be that we regularly keep each other in prayer—even when no prayer request has been expressly shared! Each week, a prayer card with someone from FPC:E may be picked up and prayed over throughout the week and then exchanged for a new card the following week. May this summer be one of intentional prayer for each of us to be a blessing to others!
