GRACE

&

For it is by **GRACE** you have been **SAVED**, through **FAITH** — and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast.



THE PRICE IS RIGHT

Here’s an activity to do with your kids to explain what **GRACE** is all about and what **SALVATION** costs!

Find 8 inexpensive items from around the house, like a bottle of lotion, mirror, sponge, candy bar, box of soap, etc. Give each item a value (price) close to the actual cost and write it down in black ink on one side of a large index card. On the other side in red ink, write down an estimated amount that is either slightly higher or slightly lower than the actual price. Try to have about half of the estimated amounts higher, and half lower. Fold the index cards into tents so the red estimated amounts are showing.

Make a card for the Bible also, with the actual value being what the Bible may have actually cost, and the estimated amount slightly higher. Then make a card for the heaven poster, with the actual value being \$0 and the estimated amount \$10,000.

Display all 10 items in a row on a table with the Bible in the 9th spot and **SALVATION** in the 10th spot.



Give each person in your family a tally sheet. As you point to the first item, have the kids decide if the price shown is higher or lower than the actual price. Have them check the box accordingly on their tally sheet. Once they have made their choice, turn over the card to show the actual price and see if they got it right. Do the same for the rest of the items, one by one, as the kids keep score. Ham it up as a game show host might do, describing each item, etc.

Have the kids guess if the actual price of the Bible is higher or lower, but before revealing the actual price, stop to see how well the kids are doing so far. Ask if any team got eight correct, seven, six, etc. Then turn over the Bible price. Whether the kids said the actual price is higher or lower doesn’t really matter. Explain that even a Bible has a price, and can be bought.

Last, have them guess if the actual price for Salvation is higher or lower than \$10,000. The price of Salvation is important. As you turn over the card to reveal the actual price of \$0, explain how Salvation is absolutely free. Not even one hundred thousand million dollars can buy Salvation. Give a special treat to anyone who got the answer right.

CONNECTING THOUGHTS FOR THE SUMMER

Guests and visitors are regularly attending both services, and you could be the difference that makes them feel welcomed to our community of faith!

This summer, many individuals and small groups are taking time to help out around the buildings and grounds- to organize, spruce things up, and support Lou and the House Committee with other general maintenance items. We have already seen new lines painted in the parking lots, some weeding (which is a never-ending task!), new grass planted along the side, an overhaul of the nursery (painting, new carpet and cupboards, organization of toys), and organization of the Christmas closet, dining room cupboards, and storage area behind the kitchen. This is a great start, but Lou Pasquale has a never-ending list of items which need to be done, Ede Sornberger and the House Committee have their wish list, and I am sure any staff member has his/her own set of goals they would love to see happen in their area of ministry! So take advantage of a more flexible summer schedule to contact Lou, Ede, or a staff person, and join others within our community of faith to help ensure that this church is a place that ministries can honor God throughout the year and together reach others for Christ!
