On Friday, October 7– Saturday, October 8, the ECO Presbytery of the Northeast met in Honesdale, PA. We have come to look forward to these gatherings, because we do a lot of work. *WHAT??*!

Yes, we do a lot of work, but it's a different kind of work. Dare we say, kingdom work?

Since we last met in April:

- One church plant became an established congregation.
- Discussions began about church planting opportunities on Long Island and in Boston.
- Seven churches and thirteen ministers were received into ECO in our presbytery.
- Our presbytery grew to 35 churches, with six more churches ready to join pending their release from their current denomination; two churches waiting for interviews to join; and one new church plant.
- The presbytery celebrated an ordination in May; there are currently eight candidates who are completing the process for ordination; and 4-6 people are moving through the process.
- Plans continued in anticipation of multiplying into three smaller presbyteries in 2017, so that we can hold onto our priorities to be flexible, streamlined, and foster authentic community.

So, what did our "work" that weekend look like?

- We WORSHIPPED on Friday evening and Saturday morning.
- The presbytery GAVE \$3,000 from our small budget to a seminarian, as he begins to raise funds to plant a multi-ethnic, multi-cultural ECO church in Jamaica Plains, Boston.
- We continued the process of getting ready to MULTIPLY in 2017 from one into three presbyteries, so that we can remain small enough to connect effectively as pastors, Sessions, and congregations.
- We spent time gathered together in our new presbyteries to BUILD RELATIONSHIPS.
- We met in small groups to get to know each other and PRAY for each other.
- We learned about MISSION opportunities going on in our presbytery, often with invitations to participate.
- An OFFERING was taken to help relief efforts following Hurricane Matthew.
- We WELCOMED new pastors and congregations.
- We LAUGHED with and LEARNED from one another.

There is some kingdom work going on at FPC:Endicott as well:

God is stirring spiritual growth among people already here. The Holy Spirit is sending spiritually thirsty people into the lives of those who are asking. People in small groups are asking, "What more does God want us to do within our community to expand His kingdom?" The climbing ministry is bearing fruit. Children and teens have jumped back into learning God's story. Several new people are using their spiritual gifts to serve in the choir, children's ministry, Samaritan Supper, & more. People are committing to seasons of intentional prayer.

SESSION UPDATE - Linda Willets, Clerk of Session

SESSION EDUCATION/TRAINING:

 As part of the ECO study on the Book of Confessions, the elders studied "The Scots Confession of 1560" at their regular October meeting.

SESSION WORK:

- David Jenkins and Sharon Early were elected commissioners for the October 7-8 Presbytery Meeting.
- Session approved Rev. Dr. Tim Devine, Rev. Jan Devine, Church Program Staff (who would benefit), and elders to attend the ECO National Gathering - January 24-26, 2017 in Greenville, SC.
- A Congregational Meeting for November 20, 2016 was approved to elect the new class of deacons and elders. If revised by-laws are ready, they will also be on the agenda.
- Session approved the proposed 2017 budget as presented by Art Davis.
- A 2% bonus, to be paid in December 2016, was approved for FPC:E Staff. FPC:E staff did not receive salary increases in 2016.

FPC:E MISSION/EVANGELISM:

- Elders reflected on the value of the "Personal Evangelism for Ordinary People" weekend with Chris Walker and the importance of using what we learned to make sharing the Good News a conscious and regular part of our daily lives.
- Stewardship Dedication Sunday is November 13, 2016. A 48-hour congregational prayer vigil will begin at 9:00AM on Friday, November 11 through 9:00AM on Sunday, November 13, 2016.
- Men of the church will be going on a mission trip to Honesdale, PA on November 3-5, 2016.
- A mission trip to Kenya has been scheduled from June 25/26 through July 8, 2017.

FPC:E NEWS AND PLANS:

- Personnel reps met with FPC:E staff to communicate changes in Overtime Labor Laws, effective December 1, 2016. Staff members have started to track their hours to comply.
- FPC:E Staff participated in Narcan training on Tuesday, October 11, 2016.
- Plans are continuing for the proposed construction of a new garage.
- Derek Buffington is in place as the new Sunday Sexton.
- Plans are being made for new signage for the interior of the buildings, upgrading some of the lighting, and upgrading the old copier.

CONNECTING THOUGHTS - SHARON EARLY

Seasons—I love living in this area and the four seasons we transition through each year. In particular, this time of year is my favorite with all the changing colors and the constant reminder of how awesome our God is! We know this signals a time of change and transition, and for many a grieving for the loss of the warm days of summer. (Others of us actually anticipate the cooler days of fall and winter—no bugs, winter sports and not being so hot all the time!) Because we trust that in the cycle of life we will return to warmer days, we have learned to enjoy each season of the year we are in at the moment.



Unfortunately, this doesn't seem to always

translate into enjoying the season of life that we are in currently. Is this because we don't know how to trust God? An interesting question, and one I seem to be wrestling with more and more. I want to trust God, but when I am feeling the pain of loss—friends moving away, groups in transition, etc.—it is hard. I do not always trust that, although painful, I will learn from it and ultimately grow in my relationship with God because I must depend on Him and not myself and others who are in my life.

I have been counseling a few of our groups that are going through major transitions. Even though I remind them it is a season of life and change is constant, it is hard to not take it personally when members can no longer make that specific group time a priority. We might have that head knowledge, but still feel the pain in our heart because of change and transition. My husband reminded me that without change and the transitions of our first couple of groups, others would not have been able to partake in the incredible experience of being in a group that walks with us through life's ups and downs and encourages us to grow spiritually. And I would not have had very meaningful Christian friendships that have grown because of these changes.

So, as we work to see what new groups form and where openings will occur in existing groups, help me by intentionally praying for the following —

- for our church groups to be open and missional to reach others
- for those who are not in groups to be willing to take a step and share life with others
- for new leaders and groups that may arise for a "season" of doing life together

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: " Ecclesiastes 3:1


