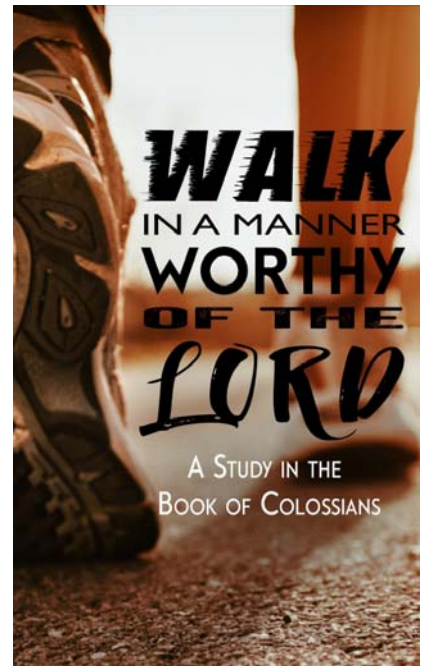
THE BOOK OF COLOSSIANS

A WORD TO PARENTS

Read Deuteronomy 6:6-9 for your challenge as parents this new year.

FAMILY GENESIS CHALLENGE!

In September, we started learning all the stories of Genesis. We began with *“In six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, then He rested on the seventh day.”* We learned that Adam and Eve were created in the image of God. They were made for perfect relationship with God and each other. Sadly, the perfection of their relationship with God and each other was broken as they disobeyed God. From then on sin was passed to each person born.

We see sin passed along to people in the stories of Cain and Abel, Noah, the builders of the Tower of Babel. Then with Abraham and Sarah, Isaac, Jacob, we see God’s rescue plan getting started. Sin still separates us from God and each other and we all need God’s forgiveness. Without His rescue plan we would be doomed to spend life and eternity without Him in broken relationships all around us!

Spend quality time reading and memorizing some verses with your kids in January and February! There are memory verses each Monday to concentrate on all week. A special thank you to the faithful servants who have served our church as elders and deacons and are now rotating off active service. They have each offered their unique gifts and passions for the past six years: Elders Adele Everett and Charlene Gebler and Deacon Saima Tandi.

The regular Session meeting on December 7, 2016 was preceded by a joint gathering of elders, deacons, and Program Staff. This year's training focused on Communion, so that elders and deacons may be approved to officiate during worship, home bound and hospital visits, and for special events such as retreats and small group gatherings. We celebrate the expanded privileges and responsibilities of leaders allowed in ECO.

MISSION, EVANGELISM, AND DISCIPLESHIP

- Session continues to discern next steps for reaching our community, as we apply the things we have learned through "To Transform a City" and the Nehemiah study. It is exciting to begin to connect with "Endicott Proud," a local movement to revitalize our community.
- Session approved the 2016 Christmas Joy Offering to be used to help purchase surveillance cameras to support the Endicott police and "Endicott Proud's" efforts to increase safety and security in our community.
- Many adults enjoyed the advent devotional, *Hidden Christmas: The Surprising Truth Behind the Birth of Christ*, by Pastor Tim Keller. There was a Facebook discussion page for those interested in reading and/or sharing thoughts, questions, and insights each day of Advent.
- A Lay Leader training class has been scheduled at 9am on January 29, 2017, led by Adele Everett. It is open to anyone who is interested in helping to lead worship at the 10:45 service.

REGULAR BUSINESS:

- Session approved the 2017 schedule for regular Session meetings.
- Dates were confirmed for elder training, deacon training, the examination of elected officers, and the ordination/installation service.
- Session approved the Annual Congregational Meeting for Sunday, February 5, 2017. There will be one service at 10:00am, followed by the meeting and a luncheon.
- On Sunday, December 11, Chris Campbell, Jesse Paff, and JD Paff were welcomed as Covenant Partners (members) of FPC:E
- As Session began to talk about Lent/Easter plans, dates were confirmed:
 - ◆ Ash Wednesday Agape Supper- March 1, 2017
 - ◆ Maundy Thursday Service- 7:30pm on April 13, 2017
- Nathan Jacobs' job title was changed to "Director of Production, Technology, and Communication Ministries" to better reflect his responsibilities.
- In recognition of the tremendous amount of time he commits to serving at FPC:E, Session approved that Art Davis be officially added as a (volunteer) staff member.
- Session approved House Committee to look into the purchase of a security camera for our church parking lots.

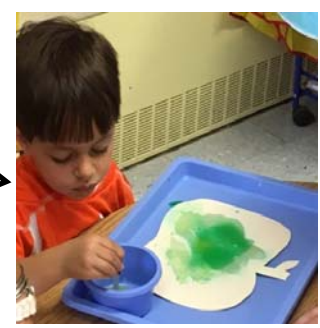

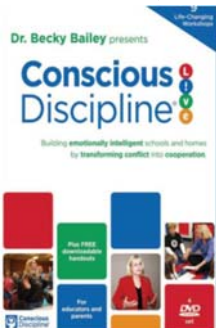

Do you have a heart for the special needs community and looking for opportunities to serve? Jane and Steve Kamper are looking for a Community Habilitation Provider and a Respite Provider for their autistic eleven-year-old son, Easton. These are paid positions at \$15 per hour and could be filled separately, or by the same individual. Applicants go through a background check and training with the Springbrook Organization. Once you are in their system, you are eligible for other families to hire you as well. Easton receives 6 hours of Community Habilitation per week and 6 hours of Respite per week. These would be fulfilled after school on weekdays, some days when there is no school and occasionally on Saturdays. We are looking for individuals who are loving, patient, and truly want to make a difference in the life of a special needs person. We are starting with our church family for applicants, and with people that our church family can recommend to us. We also need applicants to be physically capable to work with Easton and have reliable transportation. CONNECTING THOUGHTS

– SHARON EARLY

A friend recently posted an article, “This Stage of Life? It’s Hard,” which was aimed at moms in their early to mid 30s. It resonated with me on a number of levels- reminding me of that season where life feels overwhelming and raising kids is all-consuming. I felt compelled to write back to her and share a few things that got us through:

- **Needing others** (being part of a small group modeled for our kids that being in community was a priority in our lives).
- **Making time for our marriage** (I loved a small group study we did that said to do this, even if it was 5 minutes sitting on the couch together and kids were not allowed to intrude. It modeled the priority of marriage over the kids).
- **Serving others** (early on we participated in mission trips even when our kids were little. It modeled thinking outside our family and giving ourselves to others).
- **Doing something for me** (it is not selfish but maintains your sanity! Mine was book club - the family knew my monthly book club was not to be intruded on. It showed the kids that mom had a life too and they weren't always the center).
- **and of course Prayer!!!** (I have always loved the image of Susanna Wesley flipping her apron over her head and praying in the midst of the chaos of life! Again an example to our kids that our faith comes first and is foremost in our lives!)

What did all these things have in common? That we were not doing life alone but rather in community. Each of these points came about from others pouring into our lives and encouraging us. I am forever thankful we found FPC:Endicott. This church helped us continue to grow in our faith and raise our kids to understand that being in community and serving others was a priority to our family.

Why do I share this? Because this is the time of year when new resolutions are typically being made. It is also the time of year when we start looking toward Lent and encouraging our faith community to be part of a small group. This year we are working on how our small groups can actually model Christ’s example of serving others (“*For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many*” Mark 10:45).

Will you make your resolution for this year to be in community with others, serve others, and be an example to the next generation?
