Looking back at 2016... There was a rhythm to 2016, which was due partly to human efforts, but was more surely the result of God's sovereign hand. The things we focused on built upon each other, and we believe they were meant to prepare us for things that are to come.

Think on these things... Every church, including FPC:E, was once a church plant. People took a risk 110 years ago so that they could reach our community for Christ. "Half of all churches in the U.S. did not add one new member by conversion last year." (Matthew Lee, National Church Planting Catalyst) The things we value, we measure.

In 2017, could we begin to pray about starting some kind of new worshiping community, without any preconceived ideas about what it would have to look like?

It's hard when we set goals and put numbers to those goals, because all of a sudden, we are being held accountable to do something. But remember, **the things we value, we measure**.

Lord, help us to value these kingdom goals. Give us the courage to work toward them. Let it be so.



This year is no different, except we will be simplifying our time together by:


- Focusing on the seven last words of Jesus spoken from the cross

FEB. 5, 2017 ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

We reviewed the progression of 2016 to better prepare us for more effective ministry: 1) during Lent we focused on the power and practice of prayer, so that it would become a greater priority individually and corporately and undergird all our work. 2) Early in the fall, Chris Walker, Evangelism Coach, spent a weekend at FPC:E teaching us how to be more comfortable and effective as we share our faith. 3) During October and November, we studied the O.T. book of Nehemiah in worship and *To Transform a City* in small groups, to deepen our passion for reaching the community around us through the good deeds and the good news of Jesus Christ. 4) In God's amazing timing, we learned about the rise of a grassroots effort in our community called "Endicott Proud," that mirrors the principles of *To Transform a City*. FPC:E is now part of "Endicott Proud" and involved in local efforts to rebuild/revitalize our community.

Ministry leaders briefly shared "wins" from last year and their visions for the coming year in their respective areas of ministry/leadership (see the posted minutes of the annual meeting). Our co-pastors shared their vision for 2017 as we build on all that happened last year (see pg. 2).

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to take up to \$55,000 from the Wagner Fund to support the 2017 General/Local Budget. The 2017 Terms of Call for the Co-Pastors were approved as presented. Art Davis, treasurer, spoke on behalf of the Session to remind us that budget decisions are not only about finances. He challenged us to invest our resources and time in ways that reflect and respond to God's vision

for FPC:E.

Each "Climb Talk" is focused on the life of Jesus. We go through scripture and see who Jesus is, what did


He do, what did He say, how did people respond to
