ECCLESIASTES 2:11

To be honest, starting out the new year studying Ecclesiastes can be dangerous for me if I take it purely at face value. When I focus on the meaninglessness that the author highlights, I can quickly spiral into wondering why I do anything, since in the end it can be looked at as meaningless. I need to constantly remind myself to keep an eternal perspective: I know that everything God does will endure forever; nothing can be added to it and nothing taken from it — Ecclesiastes 3:14a.

This can be difficult unless I constantly remind myself that "I am uniquely gifted, called to a purpose: to know Him and make Him known" (from a sermon "Good News" by Eric Folkers). Eric highlighted the passage from the birth narrative regarding the shepherds from Luke 2: 8-20. It resonated with me, since the daily grind of being a shepherd could be looked at as meaningless, yet he revealed how the shepherds were prepared to see the extraordinary in the ordinary. They kept watch, believed and went expectantly, shared the news (our story matters – share it!), and then returned with praise and thanks! "The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them" – Luke 2:20. Their response was to go back to work (go back to the mundane) with a transformed expectation of purpose. We must respond to God!

So what does that say for me in the new year?! I need to be prepared and look for where God is at work. Keep expecting and watching for God to break through the mundane with the extraordinary! How do I keep prepared and watchful? By being an active participant in my small group/micro-group. I need to keep looking expectantly for where God desires me to use my unique giftedness to bring Christ to where I am right now! By nurturing my walk with others, it helps me dig deeper into Scripture and allow it to mold and shape me. Too often on my own, I will skip the tough questions, the wrestling with what Scripture is speaking to me— especially when it is a familiar passage. My greatest growth has been studying with others and keeping each other accountable to what we discern together is being revealed to us. If you aren't currently in a small group/micro-group, it is never too late: 1) Grab a partner and finish the "Dust in the Wind" Ecclesiastes study with someone. 2) Pray about what group you could join when Lenten groups start in March or if you are called to shepherd a group! 3) Above all else, be convicted that you are uniquely gifted and called to a purpose right here and now – To Know Him and Make Him Known!
